




Figure 1: 2025 IBFF KEY ART\_HORIZONTAL




Figure 3: 2025 IBFF KEY ART\_VERTICAL






Figure 4: Hazel-Joyner Smith, Founder & Board Chair








Figure 8: (L to R) Ivy J. Brown, Hazel Joyner-Smith, Ingrid L. Brown
